
1. Introduction

Initiating a social impact project through an event is a powerful way to maximise delivery on an association's mission and amplify the positive change that an organisation may generate through its event activities. BESydney is working with FDI World Dental Federation to understand and measure the impact of one aspect of the World Dental Congress (WDC) Sydney 2023, the Young Dentists Forum.

2. Impact highlights and key statistics – Executive summary

This year, the inaugural Young Dentists Forum was held as part of the WDC, with the impact intention of encouraging the next generation of young dentists into leadership roles in the dental society. Over 40 young dentists participated in the Forum.

This impact will take time to eventuate, and BESydney will monitor progress of these individuals in 12 months and again in three years time to understand the outcomes. The initial results across the key activities below show great promise, with early career dentists and dental students surveyed after attending the Young Dentist Forum in Sydney saying:





3. Sydney vision & strategy

BESydney believes in the value of sustainable and impactful events and understands its clients' wishes to deliver impactful events. BESydney has demonstrated unrivalled industry leadership over the last decade through research focusing on the "beyond tourism" impacts of business events. It is now converting this research into forward-looking strategies aiming to maximise the social, environmental and economic outcomes of the business events it hosts. To that effect, BESydney invited the FDI World Dental Federation to take part in a pilot project for a specific conference intervention, which will support the generation and measurement of the long-term impact of its event for their profession and their community in Sydney, Australia and global communities.

4. FDI World Dental Congress 2023 overview

In its 109th year, the four-day World Dental Congress is the flagship continuingeducation event for FDI, and a unique opportunity for dental professionals to foster collaboration within the global oral health community. Themed "Educating for Dental Excellence", the agenda featured the key current topics in global oral health and showcased the future of dentistry in a scientific program led by global experts and international speakers. Hundreds of exhibitors showcased new technologies, while a raft of networking events allowed delegates to connect with local and international colleagues. Hosted by the Australian Dental Association, the fully in-person program was held at International Convention Centre Sydney (ICC Sydney).

FDI World Dental Congress 2023: Looking back at a highly successful event



The aftermath of a major world-class event like FDI World Dental Congress 2023 (FDIWDC23) is a great time to reflect on what was achieved, what was experienced and what we can take with us going forward. By any measure, the event, which was held in Sydney at the International Convention Centre from 24-27 September, was a success, with a total of 10,752 in person registrants including exhibition-only delegates and exhibitors from 129 countries.

To break that impressive figure down still further, 78% of the registrants came from Australia, with the next major country contributors in order being India, China, Japan, New Zealand, and the United States. Of the total number of participants, 2389 were Australians from interstate, with 4838 purely there for the exhibition which took place on two levels.

In addition to the Congress itself, the ISO (International Standards Organisation) / TC106 pre-WDC technical meeting took place which saw 251 delegates from 22 countries, with 12 participants representing Australia. This meeting was just one of the many events which took place in and around Congress including the FDI World Dental Federal Parliament and a series of in-depth workshops which gave registrants the opportunity to kick off their Congress educational journey early

When registrants weren't enjoying the 200+ hours of presentations as part of the Main Scientific Programme or checking out the many offerings at the exhibition, they were attending a range of social and networking events including dinners, fun runs, and even a cricket competition!

Events of this magnitude always leave a lasting legacy, particularly in the host country, and it was pleasing to see that FDIWDC23 provided the ADA with quite a few media opportunities to highlight the role of dentists in general health especially in regards to vaping, the link between poor oral health & overall health, and spotlighting the important work being done by volunteer dental professionals in assisting those who have experienced sexual assault and domestic violence.

As envisaged, FDIWDC23 gave everyone who attended the opportunity to learn, investigate and grow, bringing life to its "Educating for Dental Excellence" tagline and enriching the practice of dentistry for every participant for many years to come.



PRE-CONGRESS



While the main part of any FDI World Dental Congress takes place during the advertised dates, there's a great deal that takes place before everything officially kicks off. One of the key meetings that takes place, and which has a profoundly important effect on the practise of dentistry worldwide, is FDI General Assembly which is the supreme legislative and governing body of FDI, and attendant parliament meetings. In addition, delegates were able to take part in workshops and masterclasses on a range of engaging topics and they could even take part in the Tooth and Wicket Cricket which offered fun and friendship for everyone who took part.





MAIN SCIENTIFIC POROGRAM



With 200+ hours of presentations on offer from an array of world-class talent from Australia and overseas, the Main Scientific Programme offered something for everyone over four information-packed days. In addition to the main presentations, delegates attended Lunch 'n' Learn sessions hosted by experts in their field, witnessed the launch of the ADA's new sustainability modules and the ADA Dental Health Foundation, and ADA members were able to take part in the Member Forum which saw all eight Presidents, Federal and Branch, available to answer questions from the attendees.







EXHIBITION



Spread over two expansive levels, the exhibition offered attendees the ability to check out the latest advances in dental technology and service offerings and to talk to representatives about their particular needs and products or services that might meet them. They could also listen to abstract programme short oral presentations and even take part in a silent disco, take part in guided mindfulness sessions or play mini golf!

5. FDI 2023 - Impact and Legacy

YOUNG DENTISTS' FORUM

New to this year's program was the inaugural Young Dentists Forum. Passion project for the World Dental Federation Congress & Events Director, Laetitia Reymond and championed by Dr William Cheung, chair of the FDI Education Committee and visionary behind the Young Dentists Forum, this represented an opportunity for BESydney to partner with FDI to pilot its Social Impact framework.

The program concept was:

FDI Young Dentists Forum

- Half-day program dedicated to young professionals
- Target audience: 100 dentists from all over the world
- Webcast available post Congress on FDI oral health campus (200,000 dentists at reach)

The forum will present a unique opportunity for young dentists to engage on their generation's hottest topics such as aesthetic dentistry, digital dentistry, artificial intelligence and practice management.

The program will include an internationally recognised speaker and also give a chance to two young speakers to present in this unique international setting. In addition it will provide educational or presentation opportunities for the young dentists around the world.

This Forum also creates opportunities for young professionals to become familiar with the mission of FDI, thereby nurturing future leaders of our profession. The forum will be followed by a networking event, providing a sponsor is identified for the project.

Discussing the forum's mission, Dr William Cheung, chair of the FDI Education Committee and the visionary behind the initiative, ex-



Initiating a social impact project through an event is a powerful way to maximise delivery on an association's mission and amplify the positive change that an organisation may generate through its event activities. It enables change to occur through planned activities pre, during, and post event or congress. A wellmanaged and monitored social impact project will result in broader impact or change occurring from the event as well as long-lasting benefits in targeted communities. Types of impact that can occur include economic, social, cultural, intellectual, environmental, legal or political. This marks an opportunity for the association and BESydney to align on mission and vision and identify collective purposeful actions.

5.2 Impact intentions

Through a series of meetings with FDI and BESydney, the impact intentions of the FDI World Dental Congress Sydney 2023 were identified as:

6. FDI 2023 - Generated impacts

This year, the inaugural Young Dentists Forum was held as part of the WDC, with the impact intention of encouraging the next generation of young dentists into leadership roles in the dental society. Over 40 young dentists participated in the Forum, with an average 65% survey response rate.

The ultimate impact of this initiative is for Young Dentists Forum participants to become champions of oral health in their local communities and across their networks, fostering community and knowledge transfer between generations, and ensuring longevity of face to face conferencing to advance the dental industry globally, ensuring improved oral health care for all.

This impact will take time to eventuate, and BESydney will monitor progress of these individuals in 12 months and again in three years' time to understand the outcomes. The initial results across the key activities below show great promise, with early career dentists and dental students surveyed after attending the Young Dentist Forum in Sydney saying:

7. Impact on the destination

Building capacity & skills of young professionals

76% of Australian attendees said they would not have attended if the event was not held in Sydney.

This demonstrates the significance of hosting international congresses in Sydney if we are to build capabilities and skills of young professionals.

The following quote from Young Dentists Forum sponsor Henry Shein demonstrate the importance of this initiative for the industry, and the local host.

We believe that our success commercially is inextricably with the success of the profession. We need a healthy profession for us to be successful in business. And we also believe that a healthy profession itself, the foundational elements, are strong national associations and engagement with those associations. **Bringing young dentists in at this time right now is so critical to ensuring that we have healthy associations at the country level to ultimately do big things at the global level.** David Kochman Chief Corporate Affairs Officer Henry Schein YDF Sponsor

8. Key learnings and findings

Social Impact takes time to establish. This will be a longitudinal study to determine developments within the target population – the Young Dentists Forum participants.

Largely due to unavoidable programming conflicts², the Forum did not attract it's target attendance of 100 participants. However, a solid base of 40 attendees comprised the inaugural Young Dentists Forum, and early results are very positive.

² Due to the global pandemic in 2020 and 2021, this event had been postponed and held in Sydney in 2023 – the first face to face meeting in four years. As a result, some programming concessions had to be made to accommodate the broader event within a global calendar. This meant that the YDF was held on the final day of the Congress, rather than ideally at the commencement of the program.



When surveyed post conference, respondents indicate there is a strong desire for Forum attendees to understand more about the various career opportunities in dentistry, with **75%** agreeing or strongly agreeing that panel discussion provided insights on career opportunities/advancements. Additionally, **86%** agreed or strongly agreed the content was useful and applicable to the professional dental environment and **89%** agreed or strongly agreed the Keynote speakers were inspirational and motivational.

This would certainly indicate that the first objective of the Forum, noted below, has been met:

To provide Young Dentists with the opportunity to learn about various career paths within dentistry

With **88%** of Forum participants saying they would consider taking on Leadership roles within their dental association, and a majority of those saying within the next 1-2 years, the second objective has also been met:

To encourage the next generation of leaders within their field.

This will be monitored over the next 12 months and again 2 years to measure the actual outcome of this purposeful intention.

Another significant outcome was that **75%** of participants agreed or strongly agreed they made professional connections during the networking sessions. 54% of respondents made 1-5 professional connections, while a further 42% made 6-10 professional contacts and 4% made over 10 professional contacts.

These findings directly relate to three of #Meet4Impact's <u>BE Impactful Framework</u> Capitals identified to demonstrate in which social value can be created through events:



Skills development / Talent recruitment in city / Opportunities



Innovation / Knowledge transfer / knowledge diffusion



Networks / Collaborations / Shared experiences

9. Other social impacts

Teeth.org.au was launched with the intention of making it the trusted source for the public when searching for oral health information. All the content on teeth.org.au has been thoroughly researched, peer-reviewed, and references high-quality studies and information.

The site contains articles about recent oral health issues, tips and tools to help with oral hygiene, information about common (and uncommon) treatments, and more, including the Mob Smiles resources created for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Australians.

It also has a link to the Find a Dentist tool, to enable prospective patients to easily find a dentist if they don't already have one.

New content is added regularly, with all content on the site routinely reviewed and updated to ensure that everything is accurate and current.

Conferences are a platform for diffusion and amplification of knowledge and ideas that can lead to change. Tooth.org.au and the Mob Smiles resources are examples of capitalizing on this broader opportunity to gain exposure outside of their normal channels.

Fit to bite, fit to fight

The use of technology and the impact of increasing sugar consumption were on the agenda when dentists from defence forces around the world met in Sydney to discuss oral health issues relevant to the military.

The Australian Defence Force (ADF) hosted the 2023 Section of Defence Forces Dental Services (SDFDS) annual meeting, from September 21 to 24, as a precursor to the annual congress of the World Dental Federation, of which the SDFDS is a sub-section.

Colonel Prineas said the lessons learnt from focusing resources on oral health preventive strategies for trainees and addressing workforce pressures to maximise prevention-led care were equally relevant to the ADF.

Overall, Colonel Prineas said the meeting was an important opportunity to gain an understanding of the unique challenges faced by militaries, dental officers and their dependencies in delivering garrison and deployable dental capability.

"The SDFDS 2023 meeting has enabled networking and has ensured future collaboration between partner dental capabilities to provide our patients with the best dental care both in garrison and in austere environments," she said.


Introduction



C. Impact planning methodology

Following a methodology developed in conjunction with social impact consultants #Meet4Impact, BESydney followed the planning methodology outlined below:

Define: Impact intentions and formulation of Theory of Change

Manage: Development of legacy activities & stakeholder mapping & engagement

Measure: Indicators & data collection process, roles, and responsibility

Maximise: Impact report development post event, iterative learnings and long tail research revisions.

D. Impact measurement approach

Following the principles of impact measurement, a measurement matrix was developed in conjunction with social impact consultants #Meet4Impact, outlining intentions, outcomes, indicators and data strategy. An overview of key elements of the data collection methodology is noted below:

Young Dentists Forum Surveys

An online delegate survey instrument was developed by BESydney in consultation with the World Dental Federation Congress & Events Director. A QF code was made available on the day of the YDF to all participants, and subsequently a survey link was then distributed by the organisers on behalf of BESydney, with a follow-up reminder also distributed. An incentive prize drawer was offered to encourage completion of the survey by YDF attendees. 28 completed responses were received.

FDI World Dental Congress Delegate Surveys

BESydney conduct ongoing delegate research in conjunction with the University of Technology Business School. The online survey instrument was distributed to the full population of conference attendees by the local organising committee, the Australian Dental Association, with an incentive prize drawer for completing the survey offered. A total of 204 useable responses were received.

Google alerts were used to monitor publicity around the conference, in particular looking for impact related stories, as noted in section 7.

Social Media and Podcast analytics

Intelligence gathered from meetings with both the international organisers, the World Dental Federation, and the local host organisation, the Australian Dental Association, over the 12 months prior to the conference.

Observations from BESydney staff attending the event were also noted.

Interviews conducted on site with organisers, committee members, sponsors and delegates.
